The Standing Committee on Faculty, Student Problem & Discipline examined the eligibility criteria laid down for induction as PG faculty based on the bio-data submitted and fulfilling the guidelines of PG faculty induction, recommended the following scientists to the PG Faculty of concerned disciplines at NDRI, Karnal:

Resolved to approve the induction of the following scientists (NDRI and other ICAR institutes) as PG faculty and guides at NDRI, Karnal. For faculty from external ICAR institutes, guide allotment is contingent upon participation in teaching and fulfilment of the standard eligibility criteria. To consider the number of seats for 2026-27 session for admission to various Academic Programmes at NDRI, Karnal & its regional stations.

The Standing Committee forwarded the recommendations of Divisional Board of Studies decided to recommend the following number of seats for B.Tech./Master's and Doctoral programmes for the session 2026-27 as under:

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed:

Resolution No.56.3.1.

The members observed an increase in the number of seats for the UG program, as well as for the Master's and Ph.D. degree programs. It was resolved to approve the proposed seat intake for the B. Tech. (DT), Master's, and Ph.D. programs for the 2026-27 session. Seats for in-service candidates shall be limited to one per discipline, with no changes to the existing rules. Admissions for foreign students will be considered over and above the regular seat capacity.

In-service candidates: One supernumerary seat is reserved in each discipline, over and above the intake indicated in the table. If an in-service candidate qualifies through the general merit list within the existing seat count, the total number of seats remains unchanged. However, if no in-service candidate secures a place on the overall merit list for a specific discipline, one additional seat will be created for that discipline. Any vacant in-service seat in one discipline may be transferred to another, provided the total number of seats reserved for in-service candidates remains constant.

Foreign students: There is no specified number for the foreign students. However, the seats for such candidates will be over and above the above seats.

Note: M. Tech students selected for seats at the Southern Regional Station (SRS), Bengaluru, in Dairy Technology and Dairy Engineering, shall complete both their course work and thesis research at SRS-NDRI, Bengaluru. For all other disciplines, students are required to complete their course work at Karnal Campus. Subsequently, they will relocate to the Bengaluru or Kalyani campuses, or other ICAR Institutes to conduct their thesis work under the supervision of an allotted guide who meets the prescribed faculty and PG/Ph.D. mentorship guidelines. Furthermore, Master's and Ph.D. students may be deputed to other ICAR Institutes to conduct their dissertation research, provided that approved faculty/guides and the requisite infrastructure are available at the host institution. All research work allocated to students must align with the institutional mandate of ICAR-NDRI. Additionally, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for academic collaboration must be executed with the respective ICAR institute prior to the commencement of the work.

ATR: Academic Coordinator to submit the seats to Education Division ICAR for the entrance examination Brochure and online seat matrix for the Session 2026-27.

To amend the Rules & Regulations regarding Guidelines for allotment of Major Advisors (Guides) to Ph.D. students admitted as In-service candidates and Foreign Students:

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.2

Resolved to approve the amendment in the rule & regulation regarding Guidelines for allotment of Major Advisors (Guides) to Ph.D. students admitted as In-service candidates and Foreign Students as under:-

S.No	Existing	Revised
1	The In-service candidates and Foreign students (M.Sc. and Ph.D.) may be considered for allotment to a guide working in the preferred areas suggested by his/her sponsors even if the name of such a guide does not appear in the list prepared by the Division for that particular year. However, in lieu of this, the name of such guides will not be considered in subsequent allotment.	Foreign students (M.Sc. and Ph.D.) may be considered for allotment to a research guide specializing in areas preferred by their sponsors, even if the guide's name is not included in the Division's priority list for that academic year. However, as a reciprocal measure, any guide allocated under this provision will not be considered for additional student allotments in the subsequent cycle.

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.3

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was Passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.3

Resolved to approve the amendment in the amend the Rules & Regulations regarding Fellowship as under :-

1. Fellowship after Submission of Loose-Bound Thesis: Under the current academic guidelines, institutional fellowships are granted only up to the date of submission of the loose-bound thesis. However, in other fellowship schemes, the fellowship may continue until the *viva voce* examination if there are provisions for extending the period of fellowship till the viva-voce examination. Viva voce examination must be completed within 3 months after submission of loose bound thesis as per existing academic rule. For continuation of such fellowships, the Guide and Head of the Division must verify that:

- The student is physically present at the institution during the period.
- The student is actively engaged in academic work related to his/her **thesis work only** during this period.
- The work already completed and the work remaining are clearly specified in detail in the progress report.

The verification must be completed prior to forwarding the student's monthly progress report, along with certified attendance, for the continuation of the fellowship. Furthermore, the Guide and the Head of the Division will be responsible for ensuring that the student has not taken up any employment and remains present in the institute.

2. Switching Fellowship Schemes: If a student currently availing the Institute Fellowship opts to switch to another fellowship scheme, they are required to refund the total amount already received under the Institute Fellowship. The disbursement process for the new fellowship will only be initiated once the refund has been deposited. Accordingly, Heads of Divisions are instructed to withhold the monthly progress reports of such students until the required deposit is confirmed.

3. Fellowship in Case of Medical Leave or Semester Drop: In the event of a semester drop on medical grounds, supported by a valid medical certificate, a student's fellowship may be continued even if they lack an SGPA due to an inability to appear for examinations. Similarly, if a student obtains a lower SGPA because documented medical reasons prevented them from appearing for specific courses, the fellowship shall be maintained for that duration.

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.4

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was Passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.4

Due to ICAR counselling occurring at varying times throughout the year & streamline the semester start & end dates to be revised. Hence the matter has been discussed in depth and Resolved to consider duration of semester for UG/PG/PhD students as under :-

- 1. To Consider regularization of UG/PG/Ph.D. Semesters:** The Committee has agreed that each semester will span 16–18 weeks, with a scheduled break provided to all students, if the semester has to be condensed.

2. Extension of Second Semester – Academic Session 2024–25

Resolved to extend the last day of instructions to 22nd August 2025 and reschedule semester-end examinations to commence on 25th August 2025 to compensate for teaching disruptions caused by the June heat wave and VKSA 2025. This adjustment ensures the mandatory 4.5-month semester duration is met, thereby safeguarding teaching and learning standards.

3. Minimum Semester Duration for Students Engaged in Research Work

Resolved to establish a minimum duration of 5.5 months for semesters involving Ph.D. research to ensure academic rigor and fellowship continuity. Furthermore, a mandatory period of 18 months must be maintained following the Inter-Disciplinary Seminar (IDS) to fulfill all research obligations and safeguard the quality of thesis submissions.

4. To consider the commencement of New Academic Session for Continuing Students (2025–26)

Resolved to commence the 2025–26 academic session on 15th September 2025 to streamline the academic calendar following the previous semester's extension. The session will include a 10-day Diwali break, concluding on 14th January 2026, with semester-end examinations scheduled to begin on 15th January 2026.

ATR: Academic Coordinator to incorporate the revised version in Academic rule book

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.5

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was Passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.5

Resolved to consider the implement the new education policy 2020 to initiate the new Diploma/Certificate courses and UG Programs and assignment of International ranking to be started as per the UGC Norms as under:

1. Initiation of PG Diploma courses and Certificate Courses: To initiate the Post Graduate Diploma courses, in the field of Dairy Processing, Production and Management for the students who have completed their UG programme and working or wish to upgrade their academic skills. The course which were proposed included as mentioned below.

- PG Diploma in “Dairy & Food Quality Assurance and Safety”,
- PG Diploma in Dairy Processing Operation and Management/PG Diploma in Dairy Plant Management

Resolved that PG Diploma programs shall span one year, while Certificate Courses are set at six months with a minimum 18-credit load, both offered in on-campus and off-campus modes. In compliance with UGC and NSDC guidelines, these courses will feature a uniform fee structure and an evaluation system aligned with ICAR-NDRI standards to ensure formal skill-mapping and academic rigor.

It was also resolved that:

- The course fee collected shall be utilized for engaging guest faculty.
- Seed money shall be required initially for launching the certificate courses, after which revenue generated from enrollments shall be used for sustaining the program and inviting guest faculty.
- A recording studio shall be developed using the University's Development Grant, to support the creation of high-quality digital learning content.
- Course brochure for the certificate courses to be offered by DT, DM, DC, AGB, ABTC and ABC division shall be submitted to the DSC for finalization by IQAC.

It was resolved that the Centre of Excellence facility would be utilized, and resource faculty would be hired. Additionally, the courses will be submitted for approval by the relevant accreditation body.

ATR: Heads of the Division DT, DM & DC to prepare the syllabus and propose the course structure for further necessary action. Academic coordinator to follow up for their accreditation by Skill Development Council of India.

2. Certificate course on “Handling and Care of Laboratory Animals

Resolved to approve the one-week certificate course "**Handling and Care of Laboratory Animals,**" to be conducted twice annually by the Animal Biochemistry Division. Completion of this program and a participation fee of Rs. 500/- are mandatory for all students and faculty planning experiments on small animals; institutional approval for thesis or research projects shall be contingent upon the production of this certificate. The Head of the Animal Biochemistry Division will circulate a detailed brochure and upload course specifics to the NDRI website for the scheduled commencement in August 2025.

ATR: Head Animal Biochemistry to organized the training programme as per suggested schedule. Academic coordinator to follow up for their accreditation by Skill Development Council of India.

International Ranking: QS ranking and Time ranking are important for global visibility of the Institute. Dr. Suneel Onteru, Head, Animal Biochemistry Division who is already looking after the International fellowship and other matters is assigned with the responsibility to initiate the process of enrolling and submitting the data for such rankings.

ATR: Head Animal Biochemistry to apply for the rankings and prepare the requisite data base in coordination with the team constituted for the International Academic Affairs

AGENDA ITEM NO56.3.6

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.6

Resolved to consider the issues related to examinations regarding Supplementary Examination / SGPA Improvement and Physical Attendance of Repeat Students etc. as under:

To consider issues related to examinations

1. **Conduct of Supplementary Examination:** Resolved to implement supplementary examinations for students awarded a Grade RE, to be conducted by the Controller of Examinations within 15 days of result declaration. Students shall re-appear only for failed components (theory or practical) with original weightage maintained; however, failure in the supplementary attempt will necessitate full course re-registration in a subsequent semester.
2. **Guidelines for SGPA Improvement by Students.** Resolved to permit students to reappear in or substitute up to two completed courses per semester for SGPA/CGPA improvement, subject to credit limits and a registration fee of Rs. 10,000/- per course. While students may opt for the same or alternative courses after attending classes, the marks obtained in such attempts shall not be considered for rank determination or topper positions. The following guidelines shall apply:
 - i. Only those students who have already completed the course(s) and seek to improve their SGPA are eligible.

- ii. A **maximum of two courses** can be taken for improvement in one semester within the maximum limit of credit permissible in one semester.
- iii. The course(s) may be the same in which the student has already appeared earlier. However, the student may opt other courses being offered during the semester after attending the classes. The marks obtained in the improvement attempt **shall not be considered for the topper's position or rank determination.**
- iv. A fee of Rs. 10,000/- per course is suggested for the registration in addition to the normal semester fee.

ATR: Academic Coordinator to include the provisions in Academic Rule Book and Controller of Examination (COE) to issue a circular in this regard

3. Clarification Regarding Physical Attendance of Repeat Students at SRS

Resolved that teaching arrangements for repeaters stationed at ICAR-NDRI regional stations shall be facilitated locally at their respective stations. Course delivery may be conducted by available regional faculty or via online and hybrid modes from the main campus to ensure academic continuity without requiring student relocation.

ATR: Academic Coordinator to issue an office order and Head, SRS for circulating and implementing at SRS of NDRI, Bangalore

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.7

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.3

Resolved to consider Amendments Regarding Submission of Hard Bound Thesis as under :-

Timeline for Submission of Hard-Bound Thesis: Resolved that students must submit the hard-bound thesis within one week of the viva voce, with a maximum 15-day extension allowed for valid reasons. Submissions beyond one week will incur a daily fine of Rs. 500; failure to submit within 21 days will necessitate a re-conduct of the *viva voce* at the student's expense, ensuring all processes conclude within the maximum degree duration.

Hard Bound Thesis Submission: Resolved to minimize paper wastage by requiring Ph.D. scholars to submit only two hard-bound thesis copies to the COE office, while Master's students shall submit one. Additional copies for the Divisional Library and Major Advisor must be submitted directly to the respective divisions, with all receipts formally recorded on the final "No Dues" form.

ATR: Academic Coordinator to issue an office order

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.8

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.8

Resolved to Consider the Date of Submission of Master's Thesis without late fee and with late fee as under :-

1. **Last date of submission of Master's thesis:** Resolved to pre-pone the Master's thesis submission window to 10th–20th August 2025 for students seeking Ph.D. admission. This adjustment aligns with the ICAR Agricultural Education Division's cut-off of 31st August 2025, ensuring timely evaluation and the issuance of Provisional Degree Certificates (PDCs) required for doctoral eligibility.
2. **Thesis submission by Master's students:** Resolved to extend the Master's thesis submission deadline to 30th September 2025 without a late fee, accommodating students who experienced delays in synopsis submission. No further extensions will be granted; students failing to meet this final deadline must register for the subsequent semester and pay the prescribed fees.

ATR: Academic Coordinator for record

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was Passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.9

Resolved to consider the Feedback Forms to be collected from students, faculty & parents as under :-

Resolved to adopt the three draft feedback forms for students, faculty, and parents in accordance with UGC guidelines. The proposed drafts, attached as Annexure-II, will be circulated to all members for final comments and suggestions prior to formal implementation.

ATR: Academic Coordinator and Heads for ensuring the timely obtaining the feedback from the students

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.10

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.10

Resolved to consider regarding No Dues from ME Section at the Time of Thesis Submission as under :-

Resolved to streamline the "No Dues" process by requiring only residents of the Married Hostel or International Hostel to obtain clearance from the ME Section. All other students are henceforth exempted from seeking ME Section clearance during thesis submission and following their *viva voce* examinations.

AGENDA ITEM NO 56.3.11

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.11

Resolved to consider the Guidelines to Streamline and Regulate Student Involvement in Research Activities Supported by Externally Funded Projects as under :-

The issue regarding allocation of research work to students under externally funded projects was discussed in detail. After thorough deliberations, the following points were decided:

1. **Alignment with Faculty Projects:** Resolved that all Master's and Ph.D. research proposals must align strictly with an ongoing or approved research project where the concerned faculty member serves as a Principal Investigator (PI) or Co-PI. This measure is established to prevent research duplication, ensure institutional accountability, and maintain the ethical utilization of sanctioned project funds.
2. **Institute-Funded Research Proposals:** Resolved to establish a dedicated "Innovation Fund" to provide institutional funding for M.Sc. and Ph.D. research proposals demonstrating exceptional academic and scientific merit. Allocation of these funds shall be subject to the formal review and approval of the Competent Authority.
3. **Manpower Requirement in externally funded Projects & Clarity of Roles and Responsibilities:** Resolved that all externally funded projects must explicitly define manpower requirements at the formulation stage, including specific numbers for RA/SRF positions and student engagements. Project objectives must clearly delineate the roles and contributions of all personnel to ensure accountability, prevent research duplication, and formally recognize the academic contributions of students within the project framework.
4. **Allotment of Additional Students to Faculty Members having externally funded projects:** Resolved that faculty overseeing multiple externally funded projects may be allotted an additional student during the second round of allotment, provided all eligible faculty have received a student in the first round. This additional allotment is contingent upon a certification from the faculty that the project lacks existing manpower. Furthermore, the committee approved the appointment of a Co-Chairman for inter-divisional research aligning with institutional mandates, requiring the certificate of guidance to be signed jointly by both the Chairman and Co-Chairman.

ATR: Academic coordinator to issue an officer order and HoDs for strict compliance

AGENDA ITEM NO55.3.12

The Joint Director (Academic) presented the agenda and the following resolution was passed.

Resolution No: 56.3.12

Resolved to consider the enhancement of contingency amount of books and thesis printing in case of Master & Ph.D. students as under :-

Resolved to revise the student contingency allowance to meet current market costs for thesis printing, increasing the amount from Rs. 2,500/- to Rs. 3,500/- for Master's students and Rs. 4,000/- for Ph.D. students. The specific allocation for book purchases is hereby discontinued and diverted to research contingency. In compliance with the ICAR Data Policy, any hard disks purchased under these grants must be retained by the student's Guide for secure data storage, and students are required to submit a soft copy of their final thesis via pen drive at the time of submission.

ATR: Academic coordinator to issue an officer order and HoDs for strict compliance

Resolution No: 56.3.13

Resolved to consider the guidelines for eligibility of PhD students to involve in the Teaching Associate/Technical Associate as under :-

Resolved to mandate that all Ph.D. scholars with an OGPA above 7.00 (excluding those on probation)

serve as Teaching or Technical Associates to enhance professional skills and support institutional activities. Participation is compulsory following increased financial assistantship; the Dairy Science College will issue certificates for this service, and Heads of Divisions must submit monthly progress reports to monitor student contributions.

- All Advisory Committees for Master's and Ph.D. students must be formed in exact accordance with the prescribed NDRI Deemed University statutes, regardless of the faculty's physical posting at other ICAR institutes.
- The Major Advisor (Chairman) must be a recognized faculty member of NDRI. If the faculty member is inducted at NDRI but posted elsewhere, they must still meet the university's criteria for acting as a guide.
- The committee must include the required number of members from the student's major discipline and minor/supporting disciplines as specified in the university handbook.
- Heads of Divisions must verify the current posting and affiliation of proposed faculty members to ensure they are eligible to supervise students under the NDRI mandate.
- All academic processes, including credit seminars, comprehensive examinations, and thesis evaluations, must follow the NDRI academic calendar and regulatory framework without deviation.
- The proposed list of Advisory Committee members must be submitted to the Dean/Registrar's office for formal vetting and approval prior to the commencement of the student's research work.

The Standing Committee reaffirmed that Ph.D. theses must not be forwarded by Heads of Divisions unless students meet the mandatory publication requirements (NAAS rating >6.0 for most disciplines and >4.0 for Social Sciences/Management) or have completed patent filings prior to submission. While a one-time special provision was granted to five specific students from AGB, LPM, ABT, ABC, and Dairy Extension—allowing their thesis evaluation to proceed while their papers are "Accepted" or "Under Review"—their viva voce examinations remain strictly deferred until formal publication is confirmed. Moving forward, no further exemptions will be entertained, and the Office of the Controller of Examinations (CoE) will not accept any Ph.D. thesis for submission without a published research article, strictly adhering to the 55th Academic Council's mandate to maintain institutional research standards.

Basic Qualifications: B.V. Sc & AH or B. Sc /B. Tech/B.Sc in Biotechnology, Bioinformatics, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Microbial Genetics, Microbial Technology, Zoology, Genetics, Nanotechnology, Food Technology, Life sciences and allied areas

Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in Veterinary Biotechnology

Alternate Nomenclature: Ph.D. in Animal Biotechnology

Basic Qualifications: M.V.Sc. /M.Sc./M.S. in Veterinary /Animal Biotechnology, Biotechnology, Molecular Biology and Biotechnology, Molecular Biology, Genetic Engineering, Bioinformatics, Veterinary/Animal Biochemistry, Biochemistry, Nanotechnology,

Microbiology/Biotechnology/Genetics, Veterinary /Dairy Microbiology, Genetics, Animal Genetics, Biochemical Engineering, Life Sciences, Zoology, Veterinary/Animal Physiology, Parasitology, Pathology, Pharmacology and Toxicology.

B. Resolved that the Heads of Animal Biochemistry and Animal Biotechnology Divisions shall convene a joint meeting to determine seat matrices for admissions conducted via the NTA [ICAR Entrance and CUET (PG)]. To enhance career alignment for students with Basic Science backgrounds, the Institute proposes awarding degrees in "Biotechnology" and "Biochemistry" rather than the "Animal" specific designations. While equivalence certificates will be issued strictly per UGC guidelines, students must provide a formal undertaking acknowledging that ICAR-NDRI is not responsible for determining their eligibility for the Agricultural Research Service (ARS) examination and that they will not claim additional equivalence certifications beyond established protocols.

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Resolved to confirm the enrollment of candidates holding National Level Fellowships (ICAR, CSIR, UGC, ICMR, or other Government fellowships) into the Ph.D. program at ICAR-NDRI, Karnal. Adhering to the 55th Academic Council's mandate, admission is strictly restricted to those who have qualified for fellowships through recognized national-level academic organizations and agencies.

- ✓ Selection of such candidates shall be subject to meeting the eligibility criteria related to educational qualifications as laid down by the University for the concerned discipline.
- ✓ The candidate must have secured the minimum percentage of marks or CGPA in the Master's degree, as specified in the admission brochure of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research.
- ✓ A committee constituted with the approval of the competent authority shall conduct an interview for the selection.
- ✓ The Institute reserves the right to accept or reject the candidature of the applicant. In guide allotment, the choice of the student may be considered. Academic rules and regulations, hostel rules, and disciplinary rules shall be the same as applicable to regular Ph.D. scholars.
- ✓ Ph.D. students admitted under this category shall not be entitled to the Institute fellowship after the expiry of the fellowship granted by the funding agency.
- ✓ Divisions will submit their requirement of students twice in an academic year to Dairy Science College for proper advertisement. The seats may be in addition to existing number of proposed seats.

It was further discussed that admissions for the fellowship students may be conducted twice a year, once in April and again in September–October, and that advertisements may be issued accordingly.

Resolved to consider the Cases of students for change of guide/research station on medical ground as under:-

1. Case of Mr. Vikas Kumar (23-M-DX-06) regarding rejoining after medical leave:

The Standing Committee, having reviewed the medical documentation and the genuine nature of the case, resolved to permit Mr. Vikas Kumar to rejoin the Ph.D. program following a total medical leave of 173 days necessitated by two surgeries. While acknowledging the 83-day excess beyond the standard 90-day permissible limit, the Committee approved this as an exceptional case under the provision for serious illness. However, it is strictly mandated that the maximum permissible duration for the completion of his degree shall not be extended as a result of this leave.

2. Consideration of the request of Ms. Lohitha (24-B-DT-32), 2nd Year B. Tech student, for transfer from NDRI, Karnal to SRS, Bengaluru on medical grounds.

The Standing Committee has approved the transfer of Ms. Lohitha B. from ICAR-NDRI, Karnal, to the Southern Regional Station (SRS), Bengaluru, effective from the second semester. This decision was made on compassionate medical grounds following a formal request from her father. Furthermore, the Committee has granted her permission to re-sit the final theory examination for course DE-122 (Heat and Mass Transfer), which she missed due to illness.

3. Request of Mr. Abhishek Tiwari for Change of Guide

The Standing Committee has unanimously approved the request of Mr. Abhishek Tiwari, a Ph.D. scholar in the Animal Nutrition Division, for a change of research guide. This decision follows a formal grievance process and a review of the Student Grievance Redressal Committee's findings from December 23, 2025. The Committee noted that the current supervisor, Dr. Ram Singh, failed to provide adequate laboratory facilities or secure sanctioned IRC project funds, resulting in significant academic stress and the hindrance of the student's doctoral research.

4. Guide allotment of Mr. Jejal Anand Dinesh, PhD student of Agronomy

The Standing Committee reviewed the request submitted by Mr. Jejal Anand Dinesh, a Ph.D. scholar in the Agronomy Division, seeking a change of research guide to comply with the specific requirements and conditions mandated under the DST-INSPIRE Fellowship. After deliberation, the Committee directed that the proposal be formally routed through the Departmental Board of Studies (DBOS) of the Agronomy Division for technical evaluation and recommendation prior to further consideration by the academic authorities

5. Request of Ms Umang, Master's student of LPM to transfer from SRS, Bangalore to NDRI, Karnal on medical grounds

A request had been received from Ms. Umang, M.V. Sc student of LPM, seeking a change of research station due to medical and climatic reasons. The committee discussed the matter and recommended that the request of Ms. Umang be approved.

Agenda Item No. [55.3.20.1]: Proposal for the Creation and Implementation of "Paid Seats" in Undergraduate Programmes at ICAR-NDRI

Resolved to approve the formulation of guidelines for the introduction of "Paid Seats" in Undergraduate (UG) programs at ICAR-NDRI, Karnal, effective from the upcoming academic session. This new category is designed to expand educational access and enhance institutional revenue by offering admissions over and above the existing sanctioned intake, while maintaining the academic rigor associated with the Institute. The following framework is proposed for the management of these seats:

- **Seat Allocation:** Creation of **5 (five) additional seats** in each Undergraduate programme.
- **Fee Structure:** A tuition fee of **Rs. 1,00,000 per semester** will be charged. This is in addition to standard hostel charges and other miscellaneous institutional fees.
- **Admission Criteria:**
 - Selection will be based strictly on the **merit list** of the examination conducted by **CUET-UG (ICAR) / NTA**.
 - Candidates must fulfill all eligibility criteria as specified in the **ICAR Information Brochure**.
- **Financial Aid Restrictions:** There will be **no provision for National Talent Scholarship (NTS)** for students admitted under the Paid Seat category.
- **Process:** The Institute will independently advertise the availability of these seats and establish a specific timeline/window for the admission process following the general counseling rounds.
- The committee is requested to deliberate on the following:
 1. The formal adoption of the "Paid Seat" category and the proposed fee of Rs. 1,00,000/semester.
 2. Approval of the notification and advertisement process for these seats.

Agenda Item No. [55.3.20.2]: Approval of Guidelines for University-Level "Spot Round" Admissions to Fill Vacant Seats

Following the conclusion of the Mop-Up round conducted by the ICAR Education Division, several seats remain vacant across various disciplines. Per ICAR Education Division policy, once the centralized Mop-Up round is complete, any remaining vacancies revert to the respective University/Institute. To ensure maximum seat utilization and provide opportunities to meritorious candidates, ICAR-NDRI proposes a **Spot Round Admission** process.

The Standing Committee has endorsed the proposal to conduct institutional-level counseling. While the core merit and eligibility criteria will mirror the ICAR-NTA standards, a

specific relaxation regarding the **Date of Degree Completion** is proposed to accommodate high-ranking students whose final results were delayed due to varying university calendars.

Proposed Guidelines for Spot Round Admissions

I. Eligibility & Merit

- **Entrance Merit:** Only candidates who appeared in the relevant **ICAR-AIEEA (PG)/AICE-JRF/SRF (Ph. D)** or **CUET-UG (ICAR)** examinations for the current academic year are eligible.
- **Rank Order:** Admissions shall be made strictly on the basis of the merit rank/score obtained in the national-level entrance examination.
- **ICAR Norms:** All other eligibility criteria regarding age, subjects, and reservation policies will remain as per the ICAR Information Brochure.

II. Relaxation in Degree Completion

- **Revised Provision:** In a departure from the strict cutoff dates used in initial rounds, candidates who have completed all requirements for their degree (including viva-voce/final exams) but are awaiting formal certification may be considered, provided they submit proof of completion by the designated **University Spot Round Reporting Date**.

III. Administrative Procedure

1. **Notification:** The Institute will publish a vacancy matrix on the official website after the final ICAR Mop-Up round.
2. **Application:** Interested eligible candidates must register through the Institute’s portal within the stipulated timeframe.
3. **Physical/Online Counseling:** A dedicated counseling session will be held at ICAR-NDRI, Karnal.
4. **No NTS/Scholarship:** It is clarified that students admitted through the University-level Spot Round may not be eligible for ICAR National Talent Scholarships (NTS) unless specifically sanctioned by the council.

3. Points for Discussion and Approval

1. **Approval of the Relaxation:** Formal endorsement of the extended deadline for degree completion.
2. **Fee Collection:** Authorization to collect the full semester fee at the time of spot allotment to ensure seat commitment.
3. **Timeline:** Approval of the proposed window for advertisement and final admission closure.

The Committee resolved to approve the guidelines for Spot Round Admissions as presented. The University is authorized to fill the vacant seats reverting from the ICAR quota by following the merit of the entrance examination, ensuring that no seat goes unfilled for the academic session.

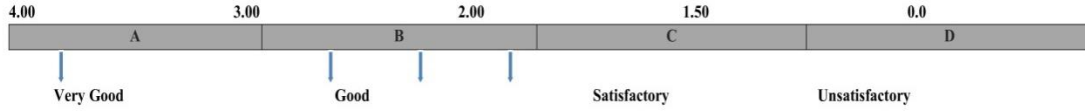
